Senior Resource Information

From the Maryland Office of People's Counsel Can your utility service be shut off in the cold weather?

Can the utility shut off your electricity and gas during the winter months if you do not pay your bill? **The short answer is yes**, but there are some restrictions.

Winter protections:

From November 1 to March 31, there are some rules to protect customers in cold weather. However, there is no rule that stops shut offs just because it's winter.
